PREPARING FOR MARRIAGE

Covenant and Counseling Application

ANY MSC COUPLE who would like to be married by an MSC pastor OR use our church for their wedding ceremony is required to go through premarital counseling. MSC couples who plan to have their ceremony elsewhere and performed by someone other than an MSC pastor, are also encouraged to go through our program.

Getting Started:

- 1) Separate copies of the forms contained herein must be filled out by BOTH THE BRIDE AND GROOM to-be and returned to the church office by e-mail, fax, mail, or dropped off at the church office (contact information below).
- 2) Once we receive your completed forms, you will be contacted to schedule a pastoral interview.
- 3) A \$55 fee is due at the time of your pastoral meeting. This covers the cost of your materials for the program.
- 4) After your initial pastoral interview, you will be connected with a *Preparing for Marriage* mentor couple who will walk with you through the program.

Our Preparing for Marriage program consists of mentoring couples who are **not** professional counselors but friends who have worked through marriage issues of their own and are willing to come alongside an engaged couple to help prepare them for marriage. They are a group of couples who have been married for several years, love the Lord and are willing to be open about their marriage walk. Mentoring couples assist MSC Pastors in preparing couples for marriage and then walk (as friends) with the newly married couple for the first 12-24 months.

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MSC Position on Marriage and Sexuality

Marriage. The testimony of the God-breathed Holy Scriptures is that the marriage covenant shall be reserved only for one man with one woman. The idea that marriage is a covenant only between one man and one woman has been the traditional definition of marriage for all of human history (“Traditional Definition of Marriage”). Because of the longstanding importance of the Traditional Definition of Marriage to humans and their relationships and communities, and, most importantly, the fact that God has ordained that marriage be between one man and one woman, as clearly conveyed in God’s inerrant Scriptures, including for example in Matthew 19:4-6 where in speaking about marriage Jesus referred to the fact that “he which made them at the beginning made them male and female,” the Church hereby creates this policy, which shall be known as the “Marriage Policy.”

Under Mountain Springs Church’s Marriage Policy, the Traditional Definition of Marriage is the only definition of marriage that will be recognized or accepted. No director, officer, employee, servant, agent, or any person, corporation, organization, or entity under the direction or control of Mountain Springs Church shall commit any act or omission, or make any decision whatever, that would be inconsistent with, or that could be perceived by any person to be inconsistent with, full support of Mountain Springs Church’s Marriage Policy and strict adherence to the Traditional Definition of Marriage rather than any alternative to the Traditional Definition of Marriage.

Mountain Springs Church’s Marriage Policy specifically prohibits acts or omissions including but not limited to permitting any Church assets or property, whether real property, personal property, intangible property, or any property or asset of any kind that is subject to the direction or control of the Church, to be used in any manner that would be or could be perceived by any person to be inconsistent with Mountain Springs Church’s Marriage Policy or the Traditional Definition of Marriage, including but not limited to permitting any church facilities to be used by any person, organization, corporation, or group that would or might use such facilities to convey, intentionally or by implication, what might be perceived as a favorable impression about any definition of marriage other than the Traditional Definition of Marriage.

Mountain Springs Church's Marriage Policy is based upon God's will for human life as conveyed to us through the Holy Scriptures, upon which Mountain Springs Church has been founded and anchored, and this Marriage Policy shall not be subject to change through popular vote; referendum; prevailing opinion of members or the general public; influence of or interpretation by any government authority, agency, or official action; or legal developments on the local, state, or federal level. (See Gen. 2:18-24; 1:27-28; Matt. 19:4-6; Eph. 5: 23, 25, 31-32.)

Common-Law Marriage. In no case shall persons be accepted into membership and/or employment who are known to be living in a common-law state of matrimony.

Sexuality. Sexuality and the divinely prescribed boundaries for the expression thereof is covered clearly in the Holy Scriptures, which limit sexual expression to the marital relationship of one man with one woman. Homosexual acts, adultery, bestiality, and all forms of fornication are categorically condemned in the Holy Scriptures. (See 1 Cor. 6:18; 1 Thes. 4:3; Rom. 1:26-27; Prov. 5:3-5, 8-13; 7:21-27; Gal. 5:19; Exodus 20:14; Deut. 5:18; Matt. 5:27; 19:18; Luke 18:20; Rom. 13:9; James 2:11; Lev. 20:10-21; 1 Cor. 10:8; 6:18; Jude 7.) Furthermore, the Church believes that sexuality is assigned by God at birth, whatever that may be, and the Holy Scripture does not permit an individual from altering their sexual identity physically or otherwise. (See Deut. 23:1.)

Pre-Marriage Covenant

We, as a couple, agree to regular church attendance at MSC.

We, as a couple, agree to fill out this pre-marital counseling form, take the PREPARE inventory and participate in all pre-marital sessions with the pastor and/or Preparing for Marriage (PFM) mentor couple to discuss the information on these forms.

We, as a couple, agree to live separately until marriage.*

We, as a couple, agree to refrain from sexual involvement until after our wedding.*

If divorced, I agree to at least a one year gap between the end of the last marriage and this one.

We, as a couple, acknowledge MSC's position on Marriage and Sexuality.

We, as a couple, agree to meet with our Preparing for Marriage mentors at least three times within the first year after being married. These mentors will be assigned by the church.

**In order to enter into a God-honoring, biblical, and pure Christian marriage relationship, if you are currently living together and/or are sexually active with each other, we would ask that you covenant/agree to live separately and refrain from further sexual activity until after your wedding in order to focus your attention and energies on building a God-honoring relationship and building a biblical and God-honoring foundation for your future marriage.*
